# MHABC to meet with the Agriculture Land Use Commission

The Agriculture Land Commission introduced a new regulation in February 2019 restricting the location of secondary homes on Agriculture Land Reserve lands. The new process allows only ALR lands having farm status to be permissible for secondary homes and final approval is subject to Agriculture Land Commission discretion.

The full fifteen-page document is available by accessing the Agriculture Land Commission website and accessing Information Bulletin 05.

The MHABC Board has submitted a letter to the Agriculture Land



Commission requesting an immediate meeting to discuss the status of the new regulation. A meeting is expected to be scheduled within the week.

#### 2019 MHABC Awards Reminder

The MHABC currently has three award programs in place including:

#### 1. Grant McDowell Memorial Bursary Awards:

Grant was the manager of the Moduline Industries plant in Penticton and played major roles in the MHABC. In his passing, the Grant McDowell Bursary Award was established to provide bursaries to MHABC members and employees having children graduating in 2019 and commencing post-secondary education later in 2019. The bursary was formerly known as the Pioneer Bursary Award.

# 2. Manufactured Housing Person of the Year Award.

## **BOARD MATTERS**

#### Winter Board Meeting Schedule

During the winter, the Board held a conference call on January 22,2019. An in-person meeting was held on March 12th in Kelowna.

The next meeting will be held by conference call on April 16<sup>th</sup>

#### Home shipments exceed plan at end of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter

Home shipments exceeded plan at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter ending February 28, 2019. The 2018-19 budget and rates were based on an average of 75 homes per month. Total 4<sup>th</sup> quarter shipments were 218 homes for a total of 1029 homes or an average of 86 homes per month. Actual expenditures are below plan. The increased revenues and lower expenses result in a significantly lower deficit than plan.

## Fiscal 2019-20 Budget and Preliminary Home Shipment Fees Established

Following the January 2019 Board meeting and review of the 2019-20 budget, the preliminary fiscal year's home shipment fees were announced. The new rate becomes effective March 1<sup>st</sup>. The overall rate, which includes the Operations and Marketing components, will see a reduction of \$ 10 per home from the 2018-19 rate. Of most importance, the Board has elected to increase the contribution to the Ronald McDonald House charity from \$5 to \$10 per home shipped. The rate notification was circulated in late January and is available in the Members Only Section of MHABC.com

#### MHABC By-Law Amendments to be Recommended

From the Board's Governance Review session held at Sun Peaks in October 2018, a number of amendments to the MHABC by-laws will be recommended at the upcoming AGM. A detailed summary of changes will be provided in the Conference package however in summarizing the proposed recommendations

- Increase the size of the Board of Directors and bring-in term limits
- Develop a more formalized Directors Nominations process
- Amend by-laws terminology to change Dealers to Retailers
- Require updated written policies to confirm MHABC positions on areas ranging from safety to financial management.

## 2019 Nominations Committee Established

President Weicker proposed the 2019 Nominations Committee process be cochaired by the past year's chair Ray Weicker with the addition of Moduline's Lloyd DeHart. This process has been approved by the Board.

The co-chairs are now the process of contacting the outgoing Directors as well as potential new Directors.



A final Nominations Committee Report will be circulated prior to the Annual General Meeting. Members interested in being on the Board or putting forward additional names are asked to contact either of co-chairs.

#### 2020 Conference Location

The Board of Directors is proposing to be identify Conference locations much earlier than previously done.

To this end, staff have been requested to investigate the option of the holding the 2020 Conference in Sun Peaks following the visit there in Fall 2018. It is anticipated the Board can announced the following year's location during AGMs going forward.

## Marketing Committee Update

While the MHABC's Marketing Committee normally meets in advance of Board meetings, FRESH INC officials met with the entire Board during the March 12<sup>th</sup> meeting. Key topics included performance of the MHABC.com, a review of proposed changes to the website and documentation of innovative factorybuilt housing projects. Overall, the marketing program is on-track.

FRESH INC will be participating in the Conference and providing an update on the 2019-20 marketing program and to announce a "freshening" of MHABC.com.

Member input on the marketing program and future needs will be part of the FRESH INC presentation.

## Building Officials Association of BC Conference

The MHABC will again participate in the Building Officials Association of BC Spring Conference which is being held from May 28<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup> at Vancouver's Hyatt Hotel.

The MHABC will have a trade show booth at the event and anticipates conducting a 45-minute symposium.



The BOABC Conference provides the opportunity for the MHABC to meet with a broad range of building officials from across the province and provide updated information on factory-built housing standards. The UBCM event provides the opportunity to meet with a broad range of provincial and local government politicians and officials.

# WHAT'S NEW?

#### 2019 Federal Budget Critique

The following summarizes key information from the Canadian Home Builders Association's critique of the Federal Budget tabled on March 20<sup>th</sup>.

CHBA advocacy was very successful in recent months, putting housing affordability front and centre on the political radar. The results of the efforts showed in the 2019 Federal Budget tabled this week, as housing affordability and a new First-Time Home Buyer Incentive program were the lead highlight. The document went on to focus on addressing housing supply, increasing the Home Buyers' Plan, and supporting home energy retrofits. It also alluded to potential future changes to the stress test (the domain of OSFI, not the government or Department of Finance). The CHBA will continue to push for more action, like on the stress test, but there is no question the Association was very successful in getting housing affordability the focus of the budget.

#### Additional Federal Budget detail:

- An update to the Home Buyers' Plan, increasing the withdrawal limit from an individual RRSP from \$25,000 to \$35,000, applicable to withdrawals made after March 19th, 2019;
- An update to the Home Buyers Plan after the breakup of a marriage or common-law partnership so that those funds can be used again in a subsequent new home purchase;
- A Canada Training Benefit that will to chip in a small amount towards the cost of training fees. It's a credit of \$250 a year that can accumulate to help pay for future training, up to \$5,000 over a person's career;
- A \$1.25 Billion dollar program to allow eligible home buyers to finance part of their purchase through a shared-equity mortgage with CMHC. For those who make a less-than 20% down payment, CMHC will offer a 10% shared-equity mortgage for newly constructed homes, and a 5% shared-equity mortgage for existing homes; and
- A national expert panel on housing supply and affordability, in partnership with the Province of British Columbia.




